



**Bin Contract Report**

**1.0 Introduction**

- 1.1 At the Community Assets meeting on 05 March 2021 it was agreed the Deputy Clerk review further cost savings and obtain a contract with the waste collection contractor.
- 1.2 Prior to obtaining the contract the CA committee must review the latest suggested revision. The permanent weekend collections for the Ellendune Shopping Centre.
- 1.3 The CA committee also needs to review two requests from members of the public for new bins.

**2.0 Report Details**

- 2.1 The new bin collection schedule will begin on Monday 31 May 2021. A copy of which is attached as item 10.1.
- 2.2 The grounds team collections will be monitored with a view to potentially adding more bins to their internal collections throughout the year. If this can be achieved and is cost effective the CA committee will be updated with the relevant details.
- 2.3 During the unprecedented times of COVID-19 there has been increase in litter and ultimately demand for collections, especially in areas with large footfall. Reducing collections at this time could impact on the level of service provided by WPC. For this reason, there has only been one bin collection slot which is proposed to be removed. A copy of which is highlighted in the bin collection schedule.
- 2.4 The bins at the Ellendune Shopping Centre were overflowing on Monday mornings due to high usage over the weekends. The contractor has since provided a temporary weekend service at the cost of £35.00 per week for the changing of four bins. This has been successful in reducing litter and should be considered by the CA committee to be retained in order to continue a good level of service.
- 2.5 This will exceed the current budget significantly if approved. The previous agreed schedule was £838.00 over budget, this addition would cost would be an additional £1690.00 per annum.
- 2.6 A member of the public has requested a bin at the corner of Overtown/Brimble Hill due to excess dog waste being left in the area. This is the only request the office has received for a bin installation in this area. There is sufficient space for the installation of a 110L dual purpose bin.

**2.7** A member of the public has requested a bin at the Clouts Wood entrance off Church Hill. Wiltshire Wildlife Trust manages the site within the gate so it would not be appropriate to install a bin on the site. In addition, there is no appropriate location outside the site for a bin along the road or the footpath at Church Hill. This is the only request the office has received for a bin installation in this area.
