

### Wroughton Parish Council - Precept Breakdown for 2022/2023

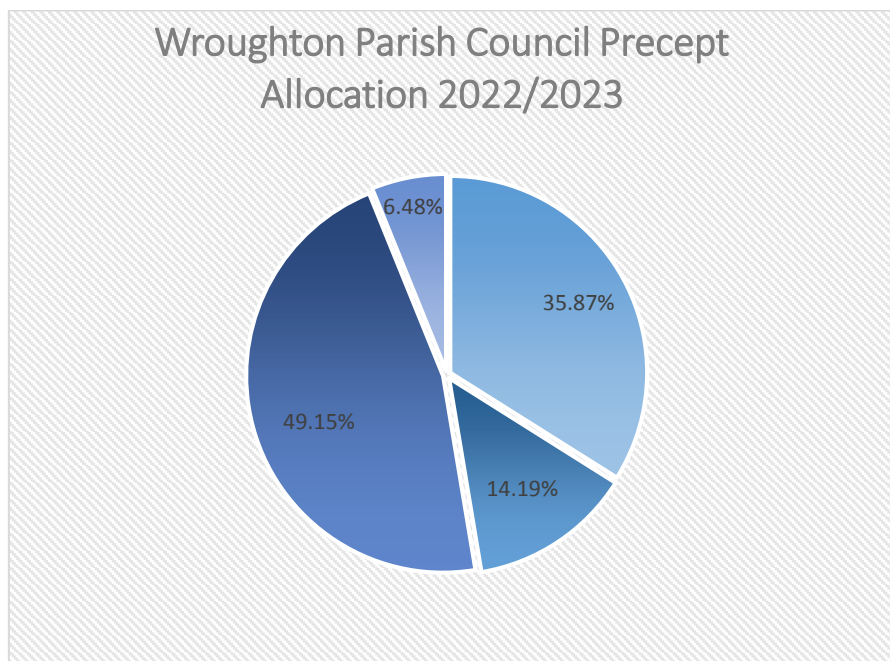
The annual council tax payments help pay for services provided at all levels of local government, this includes town or parish councils, as well as the police and fire authorities.

Wroughton Parish Councillors met on the 17 January 2022 to discuss the Parish Councils future budget in more detail for 2022/2023 and work at keeping the increase as low as possible.

All present unanimously agreed to increase the current precept figure by 4.20%, this results in a £6.60 increase per year which is a £0.55 per month - per Band D household.

The increase has been set to allow the parish council to meet its ongoing commitments and continue to provide services to the local community. The new budget also allows for the following expenditure:

- Grants to the Ellendune Hall Trust, Community Library, Parish Church and Wroughton Bowls Club.
- Improvements and ongoing maintenance of the Moat Pond and its surrounding area
- A new vehicle and machinery for the Grounds Team and additional staffing
- An upgrade to the Boness Road play area, also known as the Secret Garden
- Further areas of Wild Flower planting in the village
- The progression of the Maunsell Way Pavilion plans and ongoing Youth Provision
- Funding towards the Queens Platinum Jubilee public event to be held on the Weir Field



- 49.15% = Maintenance, Assets and & Outside Services
- 35.87% = Administration & Central Services
- 14.19% = Grants & Events
- 6.48% = Open Spaces, Sports & Allotments
- 5.69% = Parish Council Reserves supplement
