Last night I attended the committee meeting as parish councillor and would like to raise several points requested by the committee.

1. Moss has returned on the slope to the lower churchyard and becoming slippery. It needs to be killed and removed. John mentioned the parish has a moss removing machine. Can this be done as soon as possible with the help of the PC and SBC?

2. It has been nearly a year since the PC attended the meeting when the lower churchyard was discussed. Can pressure be applied urgently regarding the lower path. It has deteriorated further and it is a matter of time before someone will injure themselves. Can both PC and SBC make this a priority.

3. Can comms be regularly put out by the P.C with information and contact details for more volunteers for the upper and lower churchyard.

The area was looking very nice on inspection last night and this is mostly due to the volunteers hard work. They would appreciate the Parish Councils continued support.
