Since July we have had a lot of fun with the young people of Wroughton, we continued to run sessions outside up until September 17th when we moved back inside. Whilst outside we ran a whole host of activities including water games, circus skills, silly sports day, BBQ, laser tag, rounders and spray painting which all went down very well.

The week we did the BBQ we had 36 young people attending which was fantastic and we are incredibly thankful to Amanda who, whilst being on holiday, was able to help us source a

meat thermometer when ours broke in the middle of the field!

Unfortunately, the last week we were due to be outside there was extremely heavy rain and whilst we did turn up to make sure young people weren't waiting for us we didn't see anyone and we were worried this might impact the transition back inside. It did not and since being back inside we have seen around 20 young people each week. This is incredibly exciting for us but we are currently at max capacity with number in the Library. We are exploring our options moving forward and trying to work out our best way forward to accommodate more young people.
