5. Chairs Report.

- 5.1 Wiltshire Local Plan:** To note that on 28 November, Wiltshire Council submitted the draft Wiltshire Local Plan Review (WLPR) to the Secretary of State for independent examination. It sets out an updated vision and framework for delivering housing and employment land to meet Wiltshire's needs over the period 2020 to 2038. The examination conducted by the Planning Inspectorate is a continuous process, running from the date of submission through to the receipt of the appointed Planning Inspector's Report and is likely to take a number of months. 5.2 S/24/1348 Land west of Priors Hill, Science Park, Hanger D2, Orbital Road, Wroughton.

Erection of a temporary renewable natural gas facility, solar array & associated infrastructure: Members had resolved to make no objections and requested the following conditions, to which Matt Moore (Science Museum) has sent responses (*shown in italics*):

- If granted, the construction route should specifically EXCLUDE Priors Hill.
REASON: Priors Hill has an environmental weight limit and is signed as unsuitable for HGVs.
Absolutely! We'll use the main entrance that should have been clear in the docs. Sorry
- The construction management route should avoid the B4005 through Chiseldon and Wroughton.
REASON: To avoid known pinchpoints on the B4005, thereby reducing the risk of LGVs and HGVs meeting head-on.
All traffic to site is directed via Junc 16 now. New road signs should be going in soon. The route will be included in all traffic management docs for the contractors

- The construction management route must be agreed with the Principal Transport Manager before any works take place.
REASON: To identify and agree the safest route to site.
As above and agree
- After 2 years when the temporary facility is no longer required, please could the solar panels be re-used locally?
REASON: To facilitate the reduction in the use of fossilised fuel and the reduction of the carbon footprint within the Parish.
We'll take a look at this and hopefully yes, but it'll depend a bit on product liabilities and condition etc.
- Please could the containers be coloured green.
REASON: To support the Ecologist's request.
We are looking into that now.

5.3 Request to SBC to be notified of major works requiring temporary traffic lights but no road closure (such as those on Wharf Road): To note the following response from SBC:

*All works proposed and in progress are shown on the website one.network. This is also available to the public and any upcoming planned works can be seen on the interactive map, it will also show works within the neighbouring authorities e.g. Wiltshire Council. The link for the site is: <https://one.network>
As soon as a permit is raised by the Utility it will show on one.network before we have even agreed to the works as it runs alongside the permitting system – Street Manager. I believe the only works you will be unable to see straight away will be Emergency / Urgent Works – as 9 times out of 10 the works would have started before a permit is submitted as there is a window of time (2hrs) where works can commence before a permit is submitted, Street Works however majority of the time only receive this information the same time it would be available to you on one.network. Going forward, if there are any Emergency works which we feel would heavily impact the Wroughton Network an email will be issued notifying. [NB: WPC was informed of Thames Water installing temporary traffic lights on Wharf Road at the end of December/ beginning of January to deal with a water leak, so SBC has already acted on this.]*

5.4 Kingfisher and The Deanery SSEZ/ TRO for Peglars Way, Barwell Avenue and Deanery Drive: To note the advice from SBC's Senior Traffic Engineer for Traffic Management & Road Safety that the school car park is not closed, and at the times of her visits it has been open but not all parents are using it they are parking on the roads rather than going round to the car park, the school opened in 2019 and is not yet to full capacity.

5.5 Bridge over the M4: To note that following the previous meeting, the Deputy Clerk has contacted National Highways to formally request that lighting is included in their works to the bridge. They have indicated verbally that this is unlikely but will confirm in writing together with an update.

To note that in light of the changes to the NPPF, the Deputy Prime Minister has asked that all local planning authorities produce an updated Local Development Scheme (LDS) within 12 weeks of the publication of the NPPF, i.e. by no later than **6 March 2025**. The updated LDS should include clear, realistic, and specific dates for consultation and submission of the local plan.

16. Wiltshire & Swindon Road Safety Partnership

To receive the confidential notes from the meeting held on 10th January 2025 regarding the draft road safety assessment on the B4005 Brimble Hill/ Marlborough Road. The formal assessment should be available within the next few weeks.

To note that Wiltshire and Swindon Road Safety Partnership will carry out a road safety assessment of Priors Hill including Devizes Road Pedestrian crossing, which should be available before the end of March.

Traffic Survey on Moormead Road: To note the following advice received by Cllr Gayle Cook (in her SBC capacity) from Swindon Borough Council in response to her email enquiry:

*The speed survey took place 5th to 13th November 2024. Moormead Road north of Telephone Exchange.
7 day, 24hour, 2-way - mean speed = 28.17mph 85th percentile speed = 31.81mph*

STRATEGIC PRIORITIES FOR 2025-26

19. The following have been discussed and recommended to F&GP to be included in the budget for 2025/26:

- Vehicle activated speed signs on the main roads in and out of Wroughton: £10,000 should be included in the draft budget for 2025/26 to enable the Parish Council to purchase 2 vehicle activated signs.
- Revision of the Neighbourhood Plan: £15,000 should be budgeted in the draft budget for 2025/26 to enable the existing Neighbourhood Plan to be reviewed.
- Welcome to Wroughton & Wichelstowe signs on the main roads into Wroughton Parish: £17,000 should be budgeted to allow for the purchase of 6 of these signs.
