Founded in 1888, Wroughton Football Club is proud to be celebrating its 137th year as a long-standing part of the local community. Currently sitting 5th in the Wiltshire Premier League and reaching the Wiltshire Senior Cup Final for the second time in three years, the club continues to thrive despite the challenges of competing against teams from higher leagues across the county.

These achievements are a tremendous testament to the dedication of everyone involved at the club. As a small village team, maintaining a presence in such a competitive league is no small feat—both on and off the pitch.

Financial and Operational Challenges

Surviving season after season requires significant effort behind the scenes. Funding remains a critical issue, and without the tireless work of our committee—who organise fundraising events, run an in-house lottery, and secure local sponsorship—it would be impossible to continue at this level.

One of the club's significant ongoing expenses is the cost of hosting home matches, which currently stands at approximately £200 per game (covering pitch hire and match officials). With this in mind, we would respectfully ask the Parish Council to review the current pitch fees levied for our home fixtures, in the hope of continued support for this valued community club.
