Dog Fouling Communications Campaign	CAOS/08: Deputy Clerk to draft a behaviour change communications campaign to tackle dog fouling in the parish. Draft campaign to be signed off by committee at its meeting on Wednesday 10 June. CAOS/17: The committee agreed to the implementation plan and put £5,406 aside in earmarked reserves for campaign spend. The campaign, entitled Poo Free Parish, was launched on Wednesday 1 July 2026. Messages will go out over the course of the year along with various community initiatives. Regular reports will be shared with the CA&OS Committee.	Numerous opportunities to share the campaign's key messages.	
New Bus Shelter on Perrys Lane	CAOS/09: The committee is pleased to progress this piece of work. The Deputy Clerk is progressing this work and will present options to the committee in due course. An update report will be brought to the next CA&OS meeting on Wednesday 9 September.	Opportunities will emerge once the go-ahead has been given. Then future opportunities will be available when work starts and when the project is complete.	
Improvements to the Vehicle Track on the Allotments	CAOS/06: The committee agreed the recommendation to spend £110 to enable the parish council's grounds team to fill in potholes on the allotment track as a temporary measure. The committee also received two quotes, a lower quote and a higher quote, from Contractor A to improve the allotment track in the longer term. The committee felt the higher quote was too expensive and that the lesser quote was the better option. They agreed, as a temporary measure, for the Grounds Team to fill in the potholes on the middle track. This work will be done when the grass/hedges stop growing because the Grounds Team will need plenty of available staff to do the job. It will likely be done at the end of the grass cutting season in September.	Comms piece when work is complete.	
Wichelstowe Sports Hub	CAOS/10: The committee approved to allocate £70,000 of Community Infrastructure Levy funds towards a new MUGA (Multi Use Games Area). Members will know more about the hub's financial picture following a meeting with the JVT on Tuesday 9 June. The committee was very pleased to be involved with the project. CAOS/19: Members agreed that funding the play park seemed like the most sensible option because residents in the area currently do not have access to a nearby play park. The committee agreed that they would hold off making any definite recommendations to Full Council until after the tender process was complete, but thought funding the play park the best option. On 7 August 2026, the JVT sent the parish council a draft habitat management plan, which outlined the parish's responsibilities for looking after the site's green infrastructure. This plan wil then go to DEFRA for sign off. The office responded positively to the document but more details will need to be worked up in due course.	Numerous opportunities will be available as various stages of this project go live.	
New Bench on Perrys Lane	CAOS/11: The Deputy Clerk will make investigations following the request from Cllr DH. Swindon Borough Council has granted permission for a new bench to be installed at a location identified as suitable by the parish council's grounds team. A progres report will be brought to the next CA&OS meeting on Wednesday 9 September where members will be consulted on how to proceed.	Potential comms opportunities will be available as the project progresses.	

New Litter Bin on Foxham Way	CAOS/20: The committee approved the request from a resident for a new bin on Foxham Way, with funds to be used from general reserves. The bin will be placed by the existing bus stops. The bin has now been installed and positive feedback has been received by the parish council on social media.	Opportunities will exist once approvals have been obtained and when the bin is installed.	
New Speed Signs for the Allotment Track	CAOS/21: Members agreed to install one 5mph speed sign on the middle allotment track. This has been included in the Grounds Team's programme of work. This work has now been completed.	As the audience for this project is the allotment community, there will be minimal scope for communications beyond that.	
Upgrade of Bus Shelters at Listers and Thorney Park	CAOS/25: The Deputy Clerk will begin work on reviewing all the parish's bus shelters and will include upgrades of the shelters at Thorney park and Listers in talks with Bauer Media and the new Perrys Lane shelter. For the Listers bus shelter, Cllr LC suggested making a few minor repairs rather than replacing it completely.	Numerous opportunities will exist as upgrades to bus shelters have high public interest value.	
Request to Move a Bin at Kellsboro Avenue	CAOS/33: The committee agreed to a request from a resident to move a dual-purpose dog/litter bin to a different location due to the smell that emits from the bin into the resident's property. TH has asked SBC for permission to move the bin to the spot where a dog bin is currently sited and to remove and discard the dog bin. TH will keep members up to date with progress. This project has been completed and the resident has communicated his thanks.	While this is a good news story, it will only affect the resident who lives at Kellsboro Avenue. The limited scope of the impact will therefore mean that wider comms are not necessary.	
Bowls Club Footpath	CAOS/34: The Committee noted that the matter has recently been transferred to a new solicitor, who is currently investigating the preparation of a lease and a licence for the proposed works. The parish council has provided the solicitor with the contact details of SBC's Property Manager to enable direct communication with the owner of the footpath. It is anticipated that a more detailed update will be available for the next meeting in September.	Comms opportunities will exist if/when the parish council is able to fix the path.	
Weir Field Pavilion	Options may exist in the near future for the regeneration of the Weir Field pavilion. No decisions have yet been made and options will be brought forward in due course.	The regeneration of the Weir Field pavilion is a significant public interest matter that will offer numerous comms opportunities.	
Bin Request for Ridgeway Park	A resident has requested a new dual-purpose dog/litter bin be placed at Ridgeway Park. The area is the responsibility of FirstPort management company, not the parish council. The Deputy Clerk has made initial contact with FirstPort in order to open the conversation. No formal decision has yet been made by the committee and members will be kept up to date with developments.	Comms opportunities will exist if the parish agrees a course of action.
